OVERVIEW

This course is for anyone working within Primary Care who may need to manage patients in a pre-hospital environment suffering with common medical emergencies. The course includes patient assessment using the ABCDE approach, the signs, symptoms and management of medical emergencies, including the use of medication where appropriate.

This course has been designed around the guidelines from the Resuscitation Council (UK), NICE, the Royal College of Physicians and the clinical experience of ECG trainers.

OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course, the learner will be able to:

- Demonstrate an ABCDE approach to patient assessment
- Identify the signs & symptoms of the most likely medical emergencies that may occur in their practice
- Demonstrate an understanding of the appropriate medications that can be administered
- Discuss initial treatment for each emergency
- Demonstrate safe and appropriate administration of the medications, including an intramuscular injection
- Discuss when it is appropriate to call an ambulance
